Staffing Update

Packed Lunches

We have now completed our first two full weeks in school with the children and already our routines are established. Following on from a pupil voice exercise, we have introduced a fortnightly rota for order in which year groups go into lunch (the first two weeks were 5, 6, 7, 8 and this and next week will be 8, 5, 6, 7 and so on, giving all year groups the opportunity to go first into lunch). If your child brings a packed lunch to school, please ensure that it is brought in a **lunch box which is clearly marked with their name and class**. Children need to remember to put them in the containers on a morning when they come in, as we have a really good group of Year 8 monitors who ensure the containers are moved to the hall ready for lunch time. **We will continue to remind children to collect them on an evening but we would appreciate your help in this matter too!** Your child would also benefit from having their own **clear water bottle with their name on**, which can be taken into lessons. We have cold water dispensers in both key stages to refill them.
