# **LEGO League**

On Tuesday 10<sup>th</sup> December we took four pupils from Years 6 and 8 to compete in the First Lego League tournament at Nissan Sunderland. This is the second time we have taken part in the competition, which is designed to support Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM) work in school. Nissan donated a new LEGO MINDSTORM Education set, three expansion kits and a City Shaper LEGO League Challenge set earlier in the term and our pupils have been working in their own time to learn to program a robot to take on the challenges. This year it was themed around designers finding solutions to everyday problems that affect where we live. On the day our children had to present their robot and their ideas to Nissan engineers and then compete against other schools in a timed challenge using their robots. They were superb on the day and we look forward to developing this work in school over the next twelve months, Well done to Finlay Richardson, Charlotte Simmons, Chloe Bell and Miah Wilkie, who were presented with their medal and certificate in assembly today.

# **End of Term Merit Total**

During the Autumn Term, staff have handed out a massive 15881 merits in total. We have awarded 224 Gold badges, 170 Excellent badges, 76 Superstars, 32 Owls, 10 CXXV badges and 3 children have earned the 150 'Wilkie' award. It is tradition at the end of every term to add up all the merit totals to find out which was the most successful house:
