Mobile Phones at WMS

For a number of years now, we have allowed the children who attend Whytrig Middle School to bring a mobile phone to school. We recognise it is important that many of our children need to be able to contact parents on their way home, especially if they are getting public transport, so appreciate it is important children have their phones at school for those occasions. Bringing a phone to school is the responsibility of the child and any device brought in is at the owner's own risk; we take no responsibility for lost or damaged devices. All phones must be switched off when children arrive on site and not switched on again until they leave the site on an evening. Phones must be stored away securely in lockers (or in the case of Year 5, securely locked away in the teacher's drawer). One of the issues around using phones on site is their ability to take photographs; we have a number of vulnerable children who attend our school as well as many others where taking their photos are not permitted. Therefore we ask all of our children to respect this simple rule and manage without their phone for the hours of the school day. If a child needs to contact home during a school day for any reason, it can be arranged through our School Support Officer or reception staff. We would therefore ask parents and carers to please reinforce this simple expectation at home. Unfortunately, any child who ignores this and uses their phone on site without permission will receive a day in isolation as a consequence.

KS3 Safety Workshops

In April we were glad to welcome back into school Mr Burn who facilitates the Be Safe! Workshops in Key Stage 3. This year he worked with each class in Key Stage 3, covering topics such as knife crime and county lines.

Coronation Events

We would like to thank everyone for supporting the Coronation Events on Friday 5th May. We had a lovely day in school with a 'street party' style lunch in the main hall and then an afternoon of activities and fun in the classrooms and on the yard. Uniform at WMS

Currently the children should still be wearing their full, correct regulation uniform for school. We have noticed of late a minority of children who push the boundaries in this area. The main issues are around footwear and trousers/skirts. Unfortunately we have some children wearing skirts which are completely inappropriate for school because they are far too short and some trousers appear to be more like leggings than those of a standard cut. Some children continue to wear trainers, when they should be wearing leather school shoes. We understand that items have often been purchased from school uniform sections of shops, but this alone does not necessarily make it correct for our school. We repeatedly supply guidance on what our uniform should look like and we would request that parents please support us with this, even if children are asking for a particular style of clothing/shoe. As a school, we do not request parents to purchase items like these from a designated uniform shop as some schools do to ensure standardisation and uniformity. This is because we know this can often make things much more expensive for parents. However we do ask that parents check the uniform guidelines before making any uniform purchases so that they fall within our expectations. As holidays are often a time when uniform is replaced and parents may be buying items to take children into the new school year, we would like to share again the uniform expectations in these areas, including some additional wording which we have added for September wear to make it even clearer what is expected:

- Black straight-legged, tailored trousers (standard length), worn with black or white socks. Fitted or tight-legged trousers, jeans, leggings, jeggings, cords or tracksuit bottoms are NOT permitted.
- Black mid or knee length, A-line, pleated or straight skirts (cotton or cotton mix) worn with black tights or black or white socks. Mini-skirts or skirts made from stretch material are NOT permitted.
- Black plain flat shoes or leather-look trainers that can be polished, or ankle boots
 only if they can be covered with trousers (no obvious branding, designer trainers
 with Velcro fastening, Vans/Converse style trainers, canvas/leather plimsolls,
 UGG-style boots, sand shoes or platform shoes).
