Walk to School Week

Attendance Rewards - changes 2022-23

In order to continue to promote good attendance in school we are introducing the following system for this academic year which replaces the previous system of rewarding children who had 95+% with a non-uniform day on the first Friday of the next half term:

- Each term (in the end of term assembly) children with 100% attendance will receive a certificate. Children can achieve three certificates over the course of a year: bronze (1st 100%), silver (2nd 100%), gold (3rd 100%). Children who do not have 100% attendance in one term have the chance to gain the first/next certificate in the next term (ie absence in T1, but 100% in T2 so would get bronze in T2).
- At the end of each term 100% attenders will be entered into a prize draw for a nonuniform pass to be used at a time of their choice (one per year group).
- Children who have all three certificates (because they have had 100% attendance in each term) will also receive a medal in the end of year assembly.

Behaviour Rewards - changes 2022-23

In order to continue to promote excellent behaviour in school we are introducing the following change for this academic year which replaces the previous reward of Golden Time on the last afternoon of a half term (awarded to children who achieved 80% of their behaviour stamps over the course of a half term):

- The reward for receiving 80% of behaviour stamps over a half term will be a non-uniform day for each child who qualifies on the first Friday back of the next half term. This will allow the final day of a half term to be included in the behaviour reward calculation. The non-uniform reward will only apply to children who have met the criteria.
- In addition, the names of the children who successfully qualified for the non-uniform day will also be entered into a prize draw, drawn at the start of the new half term in assembly (one prize - voucher - for each year group).

Admissions Portal

The High School admissions portal is now open and will remain open until the 31st October. All parents or carers of Year 8 pupils <u>must</u> apply for a High School place for their child(ren) as places are not automatically allocated. Please go to the website at
