The Premier League Schools Tournament

Whytrig Year 6 footballers competed in the NUFC Foundation Football Tournament for Northumberland Schools on 28th November along with other Northumberland schools. The tournament was organised in a league format, with the winners of each group and the highest placed second team going through to a knock out competition on the day. Whytrig were successful in the group games, playing three and winning three. This meant that they qualified for the semi-final against Bede Academy. After a closely fought game, where Whytrig twice came from behind, the match was decided by a penalty shootout; Whytrig won through 4-3 in sudden death to progress to final. In an exciting last match against St Aidan's, Whytrig won 2-1, which means that we will represent Northumberland in the regional finals to be held at the NUFC training ground in February 2019. Well done everyone!

STEM Session Success

On Monday 3rd December every class in school received a STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics) session from the STEM Graduate Outreach Team at Newcastle University on Monday 3 December. Year 8 pupils enjoyed a sports science session where they learned about the physiological effects of exercise on the body. They measured their lung capacity and pulse, as well as using an ECG machine to measure the electrical activity of their hearts. Year 7 used chemistry to extract DNA from a strawberry and learned all about DNA and why it makes us unique. Year 6 pupils took on an engineering challenge where they used K'NEX to build a bridge and learned all about the challenges engineers face in their daily work. Year 5 learned all about how to think like a scientist and focussed on using their senses to make scientific conclusions by engaging with lots of activities exploring how science works in our bodies. And it was extra special too for our staff, to welcome one of our former pupils as one of the graduates leading the workshops on the day!
