A group of children from across the year groups are taking part in a fantastic project with Northumberland County Council, Hyem Architects and The Natural History Society of Northumbria. They are working on a design for a Pocket Place (small spaces designed to connect with nature) which is part of a scheme to improve the active travel route between Old Hartley and Blyth.

First they went on a nature walk along the sand dunes and around the harbour, looking for different plants and animals. They spotted so much and identified some fantastic sea birds, such as Oystercatchers and Red Shanks.





Then they headed back to the classroom to talk about the things they saw and to start to think about their designs.







To help them prepare for creating their designs they made models of some of the things they spotted on the nature walk.

















The children are really looking forward to doing their designs in the next stage of the project!
