ConCa



This week's assembly and drop-down session focused on reinforcing the types of behaviour that are not acceptable and ensuring all pupils know what to do if they witness or experience any form of child-on-child abuse or harassment. Pupils were reminded that they can report concerns directly to their Head of Year using the ConCA button on their Google Launchpad, providing a safe and accessible way to ask for help. In the afternoon, every pupil took part in a poster competition to promote the message "Never Ignore ConCA." The winning posters will be displayed in key areas around the school as a powerful reminder to speak up, call out harmful behaviour, and report it whenever it occurs.













Spotlight on ... Computing!

Bebras UK

All students have taken part in the Bebras UK Challenge 2025, an exciting national competition that encourages young people to develop their computational thinking and problem-solving skills. Throughout the challenge, pupils tackled a series of puzzles and logical tasks designed to stretch their thinking and spark curiosity about computer science. It has been wonderful to see everyone engaging enthusiastically and demonstrating resilience and creativity. Well done to all our students for taking part and representing the school so brilliantly!





Year 8

The Year 8's have been exploring the fascinating world inside computers, discovering what key components like the CPU, RAM, ROM, and motherboard do and why they are so important. As part of their learning, they also investigated how tiny transistors work behind the scenes to switch and transmit signals, helping computers process information at incredible speeds. This hands-on insight into computer hardware has given students a deeper understanding of how the devices they use every day actually function.















Year 7

In Year 7, pupils are currently developing their understanding of information technology and key digital literacy skills. Throughout this unit, they are learning how digital media influences opinions and decision-making, as well as how to judge the reliability of online sources and use content safely, ethically and in line with copyright expectations. Pupils will bring these skills together by creating their own blog post focused on a real-world cause they would like to support, giving them the opportunity to communicate clearly and persuasively. This learning lays important foundations that will be built on across subjects as pupils continue to present arguments, analyse sources and share ideas responsibly.




Year 6

In Computing this term, our Year 6 pupils have been exploring the exciting world of 3D modelling using Tinkercad. They have been learning how to design, edit, and combine shapes to create their own imaginative digital models, developing both creativity and problem-solving skills along the way. From experimenting with simple structures to building more complex designs, the children are gaining a solid understanding of how 3D objects are constructed and used in real-world technologies. They've embraced the challenge with enthusiasm, and we're looking forward to seeing how their skills continue to grow throughout the year.

Year 5 are learning about ways to stay safe online. We have been thinking about how and who we share information with as well as who we can trust. We have thought about privacy settings and discussed what consent means as well as the importance of seeking permission before posting anything.
