








Spotlight on...French

They have also started using the past tense to describe a previous trip. I have been really impressed by the quality of some of their written work this term, from writing postcards to describing a previous holiday using the past tense.

















Year 7 students have been studying the topic of school this term and have been learning how to discuss their timetable and give their opinions on their subjects. They have now begun to learn clothing and how to use adjectives correctly in order to describe their school uniform. We tried an artistic way of learning the new vocabulary, where pupils had to study and then recreate a picture from memory. I was amazed at how quickly and accurately some of them achieved this!





I was also very impressed with the quality of written work in their recent assessment, where they had to describe a day at school. This involved a lot more writing than they have been used to in KS2 and many pupils rose to the challenge and produced some excellent paragraphs. Well done!


