
'Aladdin Trouble'

On Wednesday 11th December, there was an exciting Stargazing Event at SSMS. We raised £1760.93, which is a fantastic amount! Everyone who raised money was entered into a draw for some prizes. Well done to the following winners:



Wraparound Childcare

As you may be aware, we have been trying to identify a third party provider to deliver an after school provision from 3:30pm each day. We have approached several organisations who have all concluded that the level of interest from parents doesn't make it viable for them to do this. Apologies to anyone who might have been considering this for their child. We will send out a questionnaire each term and if more families indicate they are interested, this is something we might be able to offer in future.
