KS2 Space Club

Space Club has been a huge success! There has been so much interest that the club is maxed out to 30 pupils. Every Thursday, after school our Key Stage 2 children join other schools to eniov a live presentation from an astronomer from Kielder Observatory. Inspired by the various topics, the children are always excited to put forward their questions and receive expert answers live in the classroom! Following the presentation, activities are always very practical and creative. Whilst learning about different aspects of space, members of the club have designed and made their own planet, built and launched rockets, explored the night sky constellations using stellarium, created artwork to display satellite impacts in the sky, made spectroscopes, and designed and built their own satellites, rovers, landers and lunar bases. As well as all of the activities, our space club have been roleplaying as members of a Space Agency, completing their mission logs themed around different aspects of space exploration and engineering and tracking their progress by collecting stickers. It has been an enjoyable experience for all!


New Hartley Pit Disaster Memorial Service.
