## **Verb Forms & Tenses: Session 5**

Preparation	<ul> <li>Print out and prepare: What the Future Holds Game Cards, More Tense Times Activity Sheet, To Be or Not to Be? Activity Sheet, Spelling Dictation Test 3 and Celebration Pack.</li> <li>Source: Pens/pencils, Whiteboards and pens.</li> </ul>
Warm-Up	What the Future Holds
	Recap modal verbs with children.
	Modal verbs are auxiliary verbs which cannot usually work alone. They are used with a main verb. Modal verbs can be used to show how possible something is, or how likely it is to happen/have happened. Modal verbs make questions by inversion.
	Modal verbs can also be used to show: • advice or obligation
	• habits
	permission
	• ability
	Place <b>What the Future Holds Game Cards</b> face down on the table. Children pick a scenario and a modal verb and say/write a sentence to advise/predict the future.
	For example:
	They pick scenario card: It snows non-stop for a week. And modal verb: <b>might</b>
	They could write: We <b>might</b> be lucky enough to have a whole week off school. Can children use modal verbs in sentences?



Input	Tense Consistency
	Discuss the need for consistency in tense when we read and write. Give
	examples such as:
	Mr Hall were a kind teacher.
	should read
	Mr Hall was a kind teacher.
	<ul><li>Recap the different tenses covered this week:</li><li>Simple past, present and future</li></ul>
	<ul> <li>Present perfect (e.g. has written)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Past progressive (e.g. was raining)</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Present progressive (e.g. are playing)</li> </ul>
	Give children <b>More Tense Times Activity Sheet</b> . They read the text and highlight where it is inconsistent. Discuss their choices and look at the example of correct verb choices.
	Can children identify inconsistent use of verb tenses?
Apply	To Be or Not to Be?
	Recap the use of auxiliary verbs, such as:
	'to be' – am, is, are, was, were
	'to have' – has, have, had
	modal verbs – can, could, must, would, will, may, shall, should, might
	Remember, these all go with a main verb. They can all be negative (ie. with not)
	Give children <b>To Be or Not to Be? Activity Sheet</b> . They highlight incorrect use of auxiliary verbs and rewrite the text with correct usage. Discuss different choices and the best fit for this text (historical fiction).
	Can children identify incorrect use of auxiliary verbs? Can children choose appropriate auxiliary verbs?
Assess & Review	Spelling Test
	Use Spelling Dictation Test 3 and go through answers together.
