In March, John Challis, a poet who is the current writer in residence at Seaton Delaval Hall, visited Year 5. Feeling very privileged to have an actual real-life writer in our school, Year 5 were full of enthusiasm and were thoroughly engaged with the session. After learning about his job and seeing how he recorded his work in a notebook, John shared some poetry using voices for objects. Fol-

lowing this, the children considered the voices of some images he shared from Seaton Delaval Hall, including: the statue, the gate, the bluebells, the winding staircase and laburnum tunnel. The children listed some words then wrote their own poem in the voice of the object from one of the given images. There were some wonderful creations and John was truly inspirational!







An astronomer from Kielder Observatory came into school to work with our Key Stage 2 children. In Year 5, the children were intrigued to find out so much information about stars and meteors. After watching fascinating video clips of actual meteorites falling to earth, the children were able to touch a range of space rocks. As the children passed around a piece of a meteorite which was the size of 2 double decker buses when it fell, they found out that they were holding rock that was older than earth! After being presented with other space rocks, the children even got the opportunity to hold a small piece of Mars!! After the Space Rocks session, the children found out all about the Solar System. The astronomer brought blow up planets that were accurately sized if the sun was 4mm! Using this scale, the children stood the relative distances apart and were given the opportunity to share their knowledge learnt from our previous Space topic in Year 5. The astronomer was impressed with the facts retained by the children and shared her wealth of knowledge too. The children asked many questions and enjoyed a fun-packed morning!


