#### Tips for supporting neurodivergent children at Christmas

Christmas can be a tricky time for neurodivergent children. This could be the case if your child is autistic, has ADHD or a sensory processing disorder. They may find it hard to adjust to different light, colour, sound, smells, textures and tastes. Changes in routine can also affect how they feel. Here are some tips to support making the holidays a positive time:

- **Consider any changes in routine.** Try to prepare children each day for what is coming tomorrow. A visual timetable or calendar of events can also support this.

- Allow for decompression time after a busy day. Ensuring children have a safe space to turn to if they are feeling overwhelmed.

- Talk to your child and give them opportunities to share their views. If your child is verbal and able to communicate what they want or don't want, talk to them about Christmas. What do they want to do? What do they want to eat? Do they want to know what they are getting for Christmas? Do they even want you to wrap their gifts?

- Try to keep some routine on Christmas Day. Christmas is a big disruption to children's daily and weekly routines. Almost everything is different on Christmas Day and that can be especially challenging for many highly sensitive and autistic children. Try to keep some of the usual routines during Christmas Day and prepare your child in advance for some of the disruptions they can expect in their usual routine.
