# Northumberland Line Consultation and School Competition

Just a reminder that there is still one week to submit an entry for this competition that we shared in the last newsletter.

#### Primary Competition - Years 5 and 6

Pupils are to design either a train for the future or a logo for the Northumberland Line. Secondary Competition – Years 7 and 8

Pupils are to submit a piece of writing to tell the Local Authority what the Northumberland Line will mean for you in no more than 200 words.

All entries need to be sent to <a href="mail@northumberland.gov.uk">rail@northumberland.gov.uk</a> before Friday 18th December. Entries will be put into a prize draw and a £20 voucher will be awarded to one pupil from each participating school and a £250 prize will be awarded to the primary, secondary school and SEND school with the winning entry in each category. They should include their full name, class and their school name when submitting their entries/drawings. Completed entries would be shared on the Northumberland County Council website and used on future publicity for the Northumberland Line project. Any names of pupils would not be shared online without prior consent.

# **End of Term Activities**

We would just like to remind parents about the events happening in school next week:

**Tuesday 15<sup>th</sup> December** – Christmas Lunch for those who have pre-ordered their meal. A canteen service will still operate for those who did not want the Christmas Wrap.

Thursday 17<sup>th</sup> December – Christmas Movie afternoon will take place in the afternoon following normal lessons in the morning and in the afternoon. In order to make this event a little more festive, we are allowing the children to have a free non-uniform day where we are encouraging them to dress in red/green or both colours. Children are also permitted to bring a small treat (chocolate/sweets/popcorn) which can be consumed during the film (the same procedures will apply as per consumption of packed lunches in bubbles). School will provide a drink to each child free of charge.

#### Friday 18th December - Final Day of Term

Christmas themed activities will be completed in form classes, as well as the end of term assembly. The school kitchen will not be open on the last day of term so the children will need to bring in a packed lunch on this day. For children entitled to a free school meal, a lunch will be provided for them. School will then close at 1:00pm as it has done in previous years, however this year the dismissal of pupils from their classes will be staggered as it is in the current end of day routines:

- At 12.45pm Year 5 will leave the premises.
- At 12:50pm Year 7 will leave the premises.
- At 12:55pm Year 6 will leave the premises.
- At 1:00pm Year 8 will leave the premises.

As usual we will expect the highest standards of behaviour from our pupils as they go home and they must ensure they continue to follow social distancing expectations on their way.
