Start of Spring Term 2021

We return to school in the New Year and we would like to remind parents of the following:

Monday 4th January 2021 is a Teacher Training day - Pupils are not in school on this day.

Tuesday 5th January 2021 - Due to the last minute decision yesterday from the Government about our return in January there have been some changes to information that we have previously sent out. School will re-open for all pupils in Key Stage 2 on 5th January but Year 7 and 8 will be at home for that week where online work will be set for them. Mr Barnes has sent out a message today to parents to explain what will happen. We are very sorry about this and the short notice of it. We are sending out a number of email communications around key worker and vulnerable children and online learning provision. We expect all Year 7 and 8 children to be back in school on Monday 11th January 2021 at this moment in time.

Could we please ask all parents/carers to ensure that all pupils return to school (whenever they do return), smart and organised for the year ahead. This includes making sure that pupils are following our school's policies on uniform, hairstyles and jewellery. In particular, can you please ensure your child is wearing the correct footwear for school. **Children should not wear trainers for school unless it is a PE day**. We appreciate there have been some issues replacing footwear during the lockdown and closure of non-essential retailers and our approach this term has reflected that. However, as the lockdown has ended today, there is now enough time and opportunity to ensure the children have the correct uniform for their return in January. We appreciate your support in this area in order to maintain our very high standards.
