

Y7 ENGLISH: MISS RUTTER'S GROUP

MAIN TASK: The children have been given a copy of the novel 'Holes' by Louis Sachar, and a reading booklet to work through.

Rather than 'charging' ahead in attempt to finish the work as soon as possible (!), I would suggest reading 2 or 3 chapters at a time, then tackling the question booklet.

ADDITIONAL TASK 1:

- While reading the first 6 chapters, take notes on Stanley's character
- Use the notes to write **3** separate PEE paragraphs (Point, Explanation, Evidence) about him
 - Make a point about his character
 - Provide evidence to support your point (use either direct quotes or paraphrase – explain the quote/part of the story in your own words)
 - Explain how your evidence supports your point

ADDITIONAL TASK 2:

- Draw a picture of a new 'inmate' to Camp Green Lake. Give him an appropriate nickname. Write a description of your character and explain why he has been sent to Camp Green Lake

ADDITIONAL TASK 3:

- Reread the chapters 23, 25 & 26. Write a formal recount in the style of a newspaper report, detailing the murder of Sam. Your report should explain who, what, where, when, why, how

ADDITIONAL TASK 4:

- Reread ch44-47. From Stanley's point of view (first person), write a description of what happened/being in the hole. Aim to build up tension

Your creative writing (tasks 2, 3, 4) should include the features below in order to make it interesting to read:
