## <u>TASK 1:</u>

Using the 'Points' and 'Evidence' table that you have (attached pdf if not), answer the following question:

*Q)* How does Act 3, Sc 5 show Lord Capulet's attitude towards Juliet? How does it compare to his attitude towards her and relationship with her in Act 1, Sc 2?

You should make 2 points (so write 2 PEE paragraphs!) based on Act 3, Sc 5, and 1 point (so write 1 PEE paragraph) based on Act 1, Sc2.

- Make a clear POINT
- Provide EVIDENCE to support the POINT. Use direct quotes (which you should 'explode' and write about in detail) and paraphrase – explain quotes/part of the story in your own words
- EXPLAIN how your evidence supports your POINT and link your answer back to the question

## <u>TASK 2:</u>

The Friar gives Juliet a potion which will make it look as if she has died. She will then be placed in the Capulet family tomb and Romeo will come and rescue her. Read Juliet's Act 4. Sc 3 soliloguy *(see attached ndf)* where she speaks aloud all her fears a

Read Juliet's Act 4, Sc 3 soliloquy (see attached pdf) where she speaks aloud all her fears and worries about taking the potion. On the left is the play in Shakespearean English; on the right is a modern translation to help you.

Imagine that Juliet is writing all of her worries and plans in her diary. Write about the things included in Juliet's soliloquy as a diary entry. It should be in first person and include as examples of good sentence structure and punctuation. Your diary entry should show Juliet's character. It should be about a side of A4.
