#### **AQA English Literature GCSE**

Two examinations:

<u>Paper 1: Shakespeare and the 19<sup>th</sup>-century novel</u> <u>1 hour and 45 minutes (13th May 2024)</u> 40% of final grade Section A: 30 marks + SPAG (4) *Much Ado About Nothing* Section B: 30 marks - *A Christmas Carol* 

<u>Paper 2: Modern Texts and Poetry</u> <u>2 hours and 15 minutes (20th May 2024)</u> 60% of final grade Section A: 30 marks + SPAG (4) *An Inspector Calls/Lord of the Flies* Section B: 30 marks - Power and Conflict Anthology Section Ci: 24 marks – unseen poetry analysis Section Cii: 8 marks – unseen poetry comparison



#### **AQA English Language GCSE**

Two examinations: 1 hour and 45 minutes each. 15 minutes reading time and 45 minutes to answer each section. Section B must be answered first.

<u>Paper 1: Explorations in Creative Reading and Writing (one extract)</u> <u>23rd May 2024</u> 50% of final grade Section A: 40 marks – reading skills Section B: 40 marks – writing skills: descriptive or narrative

<u>Paper 2: Writers Viewpoints and Perspectives (two extracts)</u> <u>6th June 2024</u> 50% of final grade Section A: 40 marks – reading skills Section B: 40 marks – writing skills: to present a viewpoint



### Language Paper 1 : Question 1 (AO1)

- Identify relevant explicit information
- You can copy/lift from the text



# Language Paper 1 : Question 2 (AO2)

- Language analysis
- Identify three pieces of language relevant to the question focus
- Must use **short** evidence
- You must use accurate terminology
- Discuss word classes- verbs, adjectives, nouns, adverbs.
- You must explain the effect on the reader



## Language Paper 1 : Question 3 (AO3)

- Structural analysis
- Identify the focus of each paragraph
- Look for time shifts/chronology
- Consider the ending and the closing
- Identify any recurring motifs or symbols
- You must explain how the structure interests the reader



## Language Paper 1 : Question 4 (AO4)

- Evaluative analysis
- Always agree with the statement
- Include evidence from the text
- Analyse and comment on the methods used by the writer
- Aim to evaluate which methods create a more convincing effect



Language Paper 1 and 2 : Question 5 (AO5/6) (45 mins)

- Varied paragraph lengths: one word/one sentence
- Varied sentence openers
- Accurate SPAG varied punctuation (!?:;...)
- Ambitious and varied vocabulary
- Headings/sub-headings/bullet points Paper
  2
- Consciously crafted use of linguistic devices



### Paper 1: Question 5 (AO5/6) (45 mins) 40 marks

- Writing to describe/narrate
- Quality of writing is being assessed
- Figurative language
- Varied paragraph lengths: one word/one sentence
- Varied sentence openers
- Accurate SPAG varied punctuation (!?:;...)
- Ambitious and varied vocabulary
- Consciously crafted use of linguistic devices



## Language Paper 2 : Question 1 (AO1)

- Explicit information
- Identify 4 true statements out of 8



### Language Paper 2 : Question 2 (AO1)

- Summary task
- Identify key differences/similarities first
- Write about both sources in the same paragraph, showing the clear differences between them
- Use evidence
- Show some inference and perceptive understanding



# Language Paper 2 : Question 3 (AO2)

- Language analysis
- Identify three pieces of language relevant to the question focus
- Must use **short** evidence
- You must use accurate terminology
- Discuss word classes- verbs, adjectives, nouns, adverbs.
- You must explain the effect on the reader



# Language Paper 2 : Question 4 (AO3)

- Comparison
- Read the question very carefully what are you being asked to compare?
- Compare similar or linked ideas where possible
- Comment on the methods used by the writers to present their ideas
- What is the overall tone of each text?



### Language Paper 2 : Question 4 (AO3)

Use this formula to structure your paragraphs:

Source A point Source A evidence Analysis of methods used from the evidence Connective Source B point Source B evidence Analysis of methods used from the evidence



### Paper 2: Question 5 (AO5/6) (45 mins) 40 marks

- Writing to explain a point of view
- Quality of writing is being assessed
- Heading and subheadings
- Varied paragraph lengths: one word/one sentence
- Varied sentence openers
- Accurate SPAG varied punctuation (!?:;...)
- Ambitious and varied vocabulary
- Consciously crafted use of linguistic devices





### Practical tips and advice

- 1. Your child must learn the specific skills needed to answer each question in Section A of both papers.
- 2. Timings! Students should keep to the clear time guidelines to ensure they don't spend too long on a particular question.
- 3. Writing practice. Your child can practice writing individual paragraphs or openings and closings for the past paper questions that they have.
- 4. Test your child on key quotations for both characters and themes for the Literature set texts
- 5. Test your child on the links between poems so that they make relevant choices in the pressure of the exam.
