



## Topic: 'River Deep- Mountain High'

In our geography-based topic this half term, we will be learning about rivers and the physical geography of Europe. We will focus on how rivers are created and how they change along their course. We will learn about the river Danube and its surrounding geography

In **English**, we will be writing a diary entry and a story using characterising speech. Both pieces of writing are linked to our class novel

In **Science**, we will be finding out what solids, liquids and gases are and what are their properties? We will learn about the properties of different materials and learn how we use those in everyday life.

**Art:** We will be working with clay to create a decorative tile, focussing on skills such as manipulation, rolling and carving

**Technology:** We will be developing our sewing skills in a textiles project inspired by the Danube

**Music:** Our music topic this term is about music inspired by water, focusing on musical texture, harmonies and rounds

**PE:** We will be developing our physical skills in gymnastics, such as strength, flexibility and balance and learning about the attack and defend principles of tag rugby

**Computing:** We will be exploring physical computing, using Crumbles, to create a fairground ride.

**French:** We will be extending our core French vocabulary focusing on personal identity and descriptions

**RE:** We will consider why Christians believe that Jesus is the Messiah

**PSHE:** This topic explores safety, making safe decisions and managing hazards and risk
