

Year 6 Spring 1- What are we learning about?



Topic: 'Let There Be Light'

In our history-based topic this half term, we will be learning about World War 2. We will study why war broke out and consider the effects of war on life in Britain both during the war and in the years after.



In **English**, we will be writing a descriptive recount based on an evacuee's journey. We will also be writing a formal persuasive letter

Art: We will be developing our skills in sculpture using clay and polymer clay, focusing on mark making, pattern and shape

Technology: We will be learning about rationing during the war and learn recipes made from rations

Music: We will be looking at music in Britain since the 1930s. Looking at melody and structure of WW2 songs and also learn about instrumental swing and big band music

PE: In gymnastics we will focus on balance, flexibility and strength and in games, we will learn the principles of tag rugby

Computing: We will be learning about cyber security, how to protect our devices, and how to identify suspicious contact

French: With a focus on sport, we will develop describing our likes, dislikes, and use of the present tense verb 'jouer' (to play)

RE: We will be learning about the beliefs of Hinduism


PSHE: We will be developing teamwork skills through communication and respect
