



### Topic: South America!

In our geography-based topic, we will be learning about the geography of the continent of South America. We will find out about the physical and human geography of the countries in the continent and discover how they differ from each other and the UK.



In **English**, we will be writing:

- Explanation and narrative texts based on Tornadoes

In **Maths**, we will be extending our knowledge and revising all areas of maths with a focus on problem solving.

**Art:** We will be working with clay to create South American themed mugs and focussing on clay skills such as rolling, pattern making and glazing.

**Technology:** We will be learning about the origins of food and looking at diets from around the world; focussing on South America.

**Music:** We will have a focus on playing the major chords of C, G and F to create rhythmic melodies associated with the Argentine Tango.

**PE:** We will be focussing on developing our skills in athletics, running, jumping and throwing. We will also be developing our skills in cricket.

**Computing:** We developing our understanding of safe and sensible online engagement and learning how to be mindful about information shared and searched for online.

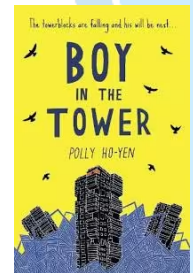
**French:** ‘My Best Day Ever’ we will learn to describe and give opinions on funfair rides. We will also learn to tell the time in French.

**PSHE:** We will be exploring the idea of ‘thinking positive’ and the benefits of having a ‘growth mind-set’
