Topic: South America!

In our geography-based topic, we will be learning about the geography of the continent of South America. We will find out about the physical and human geography of the countries in the continent and discover how they differ from each other and the UK.



In English, we will be writing:

Instructions on how to enchant an object

In **Science** we will be learning about classification of living things

 Explore how living things are classified into groups
 Research the work of significant scientists in the field of classification such as Carl Linnaeus.

Art: We will be working with clay to create South American themed mugs and focussing on clay skills such as rolling, pattern making and glazing.

Technology: We will be learning about the origins of food and looking at diets from around the world; focussing on South America.

Music: We will be improvising and composing rhythmic phrases using Samba drums.

PE: We will be focussing on developing our skills in athletics, running, jumping and throwing. We will also be developing our skills net wall games like tennis and pickleball.


Computing: We developing our understanding of safe and sensible online engagement and learning how to be mindful about information shared and searched for online.
