Year 7 Catch Up Information Report for Parents and Governors

February 2019

Year 7 Catch Up – Academic Year 2017-2018

In 2017-18 the school received £3,116 in Year 7 Catch Up money.

In total there were 222 pupils on roll and the following pupils who were eligible for the Catch-Up Grant. In total money was allocated to our school on the basis that we receive the same overall amount of year 7 catch-up premium funding that we received in 2016 to 2017, adjusted to reflect the percentage change in the size of their year 7 cohort between the October 2016 and the October 2017 school censuses.

The money was allocated in the following ways:

- Employment of Teaching Assistants in order to deliver specialist interventions for pupils who are falling behind age related expectations.
- Staff training to ensure high quality Teaching and Learning across the school.
- Teaching Assistant support in all lowest set Maths and English groups across the school to allow focussed small group work to take place.

Analysis shows that the interventions put into place in Reading have made some impact with four of the eighteen children making a substantial amount of progress to the point that they now at age related expectation and in Maths where six of the twenty two children are now at the expected standard for the end of Year 7. Pupils C, F and V were working below level and not entered into SATs. Following inspection in June 2018, the tracking process has been refined from September 2018 to show rate of progress of children who take longer to move through descriptor bands.



Year 7 Catch Up Allocation – Academic Year 2018-2019

This year the school will attract Year 7 Catch Up funding (estimated to be £3,231). In total there were 222 pupils on roll in 2017-18 and funding is allocated to our school on the basis that we receive the same overall amount of year 7 catch-up premium funding we received in 2017 to 2018, adjusted to reflect the percentage change in the size of their year 7 cohort between the October 2017 and the October 2018 school censuses.
