- Answer the Question 'How did World War One affect Germany?' Again, think about the categories that you have used before.
- Start a glossary of key words. Have clear definitions of the words: Democracy,
 Dictatorship, Totalitarian, right wing, left wing, reactionary(linked to politics), liberal,
 reform, Communism, Marxism, Fascism, Nazism, constitution, foreign policy,
 revolution, coalition, Proportional Representation. Many of these you should be
 familiar with from your GCSE studies.
