Future: _____

Change to future tense:

He _____ down the road. (*to walk*)

Tenses

Future: for actions that will **happen** in the future

Uses '**will**' and the **verb**.

Change to future tense:

He **will walk** down the road.

Tenses

Past: _____

Change to past tense:

He _____ down the road. (*to walk*)

Tenses

Past: for actions that **were completed** in the past

Usually uses verbs with the '**ed**' suffix.

Change to past tense:

He **walked** down the road.

Tenses

Present: _____

Change to present tense:

He _____ down the road. (*to walk*)

Tenses

Present: For something that is **happening now** or generally happens **frequently** or **regularly**. Can describe **habits** or something that is **generally true**.

Change to present tense:

He **walks** down the road.

Tenses

Present progressive: _____

Change to present progressive tense:

He _____ down the road. (*to walk*)

Tenses

Present progressive: for actions that are **ongoing** now

Uses the **PRESENT** form of '**to be**' and the **PRESENT** form of the **main verb** ('**ing**' ending)

Change to present progressive tense:

He **is walking** down the road.

Tenses

Past progressive: _____

Change to past progressive tense:

He _____ down the road. (*to walk*)

Tenses

Past progressive: for actions that **took place in the past over time**

Usually uses the **PAST** form of 'to be' and the **PRESENT** form of the **main verb** ('ing' ending)

Change to past progressive tense:

He **was walking** down the road.

Tenses

Present perfect: _____

Change to present perfect tense:

He _____ down the road. (*to walk*)

Tenses

Present perfect: for actions that started in the past and are **still true**

Usually uses the **PRESENT** form of 'to have' and the **PAST** form of the **main verb** ('ed' ending)

Change to present perfect tense:

He **has walked** down the road.

Tenses

Past perfect: _____

Change to past perfect tense:

He _____ down the road. (*to walk*)

Tenses

Past perfect: for actions that have been completed in the past

Usually uses the **PAST** form of 'to have' and the **PAST** form of the **main verb** ('ed' ending)

Change to past perfect tense:

He **had walked** down the road.
