Key achievements to date until July 2020:

No School Games Marks have been awarded this year because of the pandemic, however, the academy has been officially recognised and awarded pandemic. a certificate for its 'ongoing commitment and achievement in the School Games Programme during the Autumn and Spring Terms 2019/20' by Jason Headaux, School Games Organiser for Somerset.

Substantial increase in the number of pupils who can swim 25m confidently by Explore further expanding the use of 3G provision during lunchtimes (i.e. the end of key stage 2. This occurred due to the swimming curriculum restructure made possible by the funding.

Online booking system to sign up for sports clubs has been established and has proven more effective and efficient than the previous paper system. The system is now used for all schools clubs, contributing to whole school improvement.

The 3G pitch is now installed (March 2019) and open for use for PE lessons, lunchtimes, afterschool extracurricular clubs, fixtures and the wider community youth teams during the evenings and weekends.

Additional lunchtime staff recruited to allow the 3G pitch to be used daily at lunchtimes for organised physicals activity (January 2020).

The inter-tutor group sports programme has been further expanded and now lincludes Spring Inter-form, where all pupils in the school represented their tutor group in either football, netball or team building activities.

The Tug 'o' War and Cross-Country Championships introduced over the previous 2 years were also continued this year but were affected by the Areas for further improvement and baseline evidence of need:

Explore running a school staff sports club to promote increased positive attitudes and confidence towards sport and physical activity which will disseminate to the pupils.

Establish visually stimulating and motivating displays in the PE department and clear information for opportunities for pupils to be physically active/join sports clubs and teams in their local community.

An online fixture diary for all sports events has been established (2018) and has allowed us to monitor and manage the number of competitive sporting events effectively and efficiently to maximise opportunities for our pupils.

The academy led its first ever successful School Ski Trip during February half term 2019 with 44 pupils. The second has been organised for February 2021. It is the intention to make this a biannual trip.

The changing rooms refurbishment has been completed and includes new easy access changing facility and individual changing cubicles to support self-conscious/SEN pupils.

A wide variety of after school sports clubs are now available to our pupils, with some being provided by external coaches and many by our own voluntary staff.

The tutor group football program established (2017) with each tutor group is provided with 2 balls to encourage more physical activity at lunchtime when the school field is open.

Year 6 football success in the EFA Kids Cup, where Selwood have been Yeovil Club Final Winners for 2 of the last 4 years.

Year 6 Quad Kids Athletics Team were 2019 Somerset County Champions (event this year cancelled due to the pandemic).

Years 7 and 8 boys and year 7 girls were 2019 Area Athletic Champions for (event cancelled this year due to the pandemic).

Increased availability of sports equipment available for PE lessons and afterschool clubs.

Successful annual sports trips to watch the Oxford versus Cambridge Varsity













Rugby Match at Twickenham Stadium (2017, 2018 and 2019).
