Interview

Lots of people in the journalism club went to an interview with Mr Jeffries and Mr Finlay. The people that went to the interview were Rachel C, Daisy D, Wiktoria W, Olivia C, Eva H, Melissa R, Neisha R, Isabel D, Lily H. These are some of the questions that were asked:

Can we get plastic recycling bins?

'Yes we can'

Are there any plans to plant more trees at Selwood?

`We always consider this and like to plant more when we can but many factors have to be considered first.'

Can we have no paper day and no tech week?

'We can certainly try a tech and paper free week.'

Could we have an extra topic on climate change and climate science for all the year groups in geography?

'We are considering it.'

What do you think about the idea of having a pond and forest school lessons for all the year groups at Selwood?

'Would not be able to because we do not have the space currently. We would not be against it though. Forest school has been discussed and may be able to add more.'

Further questions from the interview with Mr Jeffries and Mr Finlay

What are you doing to help the Climate Crisis at Selwood?

Miss Singer has the Selwood Carbon Neutral Plan. This contains the initiatives that Selwood are taking forward to help the environment. We already use recycled paper, we have an environmentally friendly sedum roof on c-block, we encourage switching off of monitors and this year, we have switched the heating on later. Also, we have solar panels in the main building and an energy monitor in our reception area. This enables us to see how much energy we have saved.

Mr Jeffries was not sure who the energy supplier was and whether our energy comes from a green energy supplier. He will find out though.

Are there plans to have more recycling bins at Selwood as we only have one in the canteen and there is a lot of plastic around the school!

Yes, we do! In fact, I had ordered some but they weren't right when they arrived so we are waiting for the replacements to come. They should be here before Christmas. If they're not in by Christmas then you can come back and quiz me about them in January!

Could we have forest school days for all students across all years?

This is something that the senior leadership team have discussed recently as we are aware of the huge benefits that this brings for our students. We'd need to think about how we could introduce this though as it would mean taking something else off of timetable.

Could climate change be included in all subjects?

We already have climate change and the climate crisis as a central part of our geography curriculum. Our science department also teach climate science. We would be interested in running a collapsed day where students are off timetable and each subject covers the environment. Mr Jeffries will include this in the calendar review as well as paper and tech free days.

Gingerbread men

100g salted butter
3 tbsp golden syrup
100g muscovado sugar
½ tbsp bicarbonate of soda
1 tbsp of ground ginger
1 tsp of ground cinnamon

Method

<u>Step 1</u>

Heat the butter ,syrup and sugar together in a small pan until melted,stirring occasionally.Set aside to cool slightly

<u>Step 2</u>

Mix together the bicarb,ginger, cinnamon and flour in a large bowl. Pour in the buttery syrup mixture and stir to combine, then use your hands to bring together to form a dough. Add up to 1 tbsp of milk to combine if needed. The dough will be soft at this point, but it'll firm up in the fridge.

<u>Step3</u>

Put the dough on the sheet of baking paper, shape into a rectangle, and lay another sheet of baking paper on top of it. Roll the dough out toa thickness of 1 and a $\frac{1}{2}$ cm. Transfer to a baking sheet to keep it flat, leaving the paper in place, then chill in the fridge for 1 hour.

<u>Step4:</u>

Heat the oven to 190C/170C fan / gas 5 and line a large baking sheet with more baking paper. Remove the dough from the fridge and cut out the shapes using a cookie cutter. We used 9cm stars, but you can use any shape.

<u>Step 5</u>

Place the shapes, spread apart, on the lined baking sheets, and bake for 10-12 mins. Leave to cool completely. Meanwhile, mix the icing sugar with 1-2 tbsp of water. Decorate the cooled biscuits with the icing sugar make sure it's not too thin
