Women's history month 2022:



Following on from February's LGBT+ history month, March is international Women's Month. In English we are celebrating female writers who have made important contributions to literature. The first is Mary Shelley: Shelley is probably best known for writing *Frankenstein* as part of a competition between herself, her husband (another writer - Percy Bysshe Shelley) and another friend. The terrifying story of Dr Frankenstein and his monster gripped the imagination of the three and took the country by storm when it was published. Shelley is often credited as being one of the pioneers of Science Fiction writing and rose to prominence at a time when female writers were largely ignored.

Students as Selwood have been supporting the Frome Kindness Festival. We have been taking part in a kindness activity called 'Pay It Forward' where we do a random act of kindness for someone, then ask them to do a kindness for someone else. Literacy tip of the week:

Brackets, commas and dashes - These three pieces of punctuation are also known as *parentheses* and can be used to add additional information to a sentence. Knowing which to use, though, is a matter of deciding how much attention to draw to the piece of information.

Brackets act like a whisper. The information added doesn't interrupt the sentence and could be removed without changing the meaning too much.

Commas are more like normal conversation. The information is more important and is an equal part of the sentence.

Dashes are the equivalent of someone shouting. The information is having lots of attention drawn to it.

"Parentheses are the quiet whisper of an aside, commas are the conversational voice of a friend walking by your desk, and dashes are the yowl of a pirate dashing into a fray."

English - What we are learning about:

Students in Years 5 are finishing *The Firework Maker's Daughter by Phillip Pullman* and will then be going on to a non-fiction unit about climate change.

Year 6 are currently studying *Windrush Child* by Benjamin Zephaniah as well as preparing for their exams.

Students in Year 7 are exploring non-fiction texts, particularly focussed on advertising and the media.

Year 8 students are exploring poetry.

Sex and **Gender** - For many people, the difference between sex and gender isn't always clear and some use the terms interchangeably. However the meaning of the two words *is* different: The UK government defines **sex** as a biological term (whether one is born male, female or intersex) and **gender** is a social construct that is an internal sense of self, whether an individual sees themselves as a man or a woman, or another gender identity.
