## Advance notice from the Headteacher—New start times

Now that the children are into regular routines for the start and the end of the day, I am intending to bring forward the morning start times in line with the usual school start times pre Covid. The times will remain staggered in line with our Covid risk assessments. From Monday 7 December Year 5 and 6 will be admitted through the usual Covid allocated school gate at 8.35am. The school gates will not open prior to this. Years 7 and 8 will be admitted through their usual Covid allocated school gate at 8.45am. Siblings travelling together will arrive at 8.35am through the youngest pupil's allocated gate. Older siblings will be asked to go into school at 8.45am and will wait at the premises in the usual way that has occurred this term. This earlier time will enable all pupils to receive a full hour for lesson one as opposed to the much shorter lesson one time we have currently.

Mr Broad will be heading up this initiative and I would like to take this opportunity of thanking him and all the teaching staff for the immense additional planning time these lessons created whilst still remaining in school teaching all the other children and contacting families within their tutor groups to ensure well being, safeguarding and learning support was communicated.
