Literacy tip of the week:

Sentence composition - Each sentence that we write must contain a **complete idea**. A simple sentence has a **main clause** which means that it has at least *one subject* and <u>one verb</u>. This means that there is **one complete idea** before the end punctuation.

English - What we are learning about:

Students in Years 5 are looking at *The Firework Maker's Daughter* by Philip Pullman. Year 6 are currently undertaking practice PiXL papers before moving on to *Windrush Child* by Benjamin Zephaniah

Students in Year 7 are exploring non-fiction texts, particularly focussed on advertising and the media.

Year 8 students are exploring poetry.


COVID Update

Thank you to all those parents who sent their children in for COVID testing or carried out the test at home. We will continue to hand out testing kits to Years 7 & 8 on a regular basis. We recommend that these are used twice a week on a Sunday and Wednesday.

As you will be aware guidance has been updated in relation to the wearing of masks in school and pupils in Year 7 and 8 are now once again recommended to wear face coverings in all communal areas including classrooms. I would strongly urge where possible for pupils to follow this guidance however, I would like to emphasise that that there are a number of reasons where a pupil can be exempt from wearing a face mask including "where putting on, wearing or removing a face covering will cause you severe distress." Therefore we would also support any parent who requests that it was not appropriate for their child to wear a face mask for this reason and will be supportive to any pupil who finds wearing the mask challenging.

There has also been changes to the expectations in relation to the expected isolation period, which are best explained in the graphic below.


