Frida Kahlo was a Mexican painter known primarily for her portraits, self-portraits and works inspired by nature and by Mexico. Kahlo was a prominent bisexual and had relationships with both men and women – though her interest lay primarily in men.

English - What we are learning about:


Students in Years 5 are looking at *The Firework Maker's Daughter* by Philip Pullman.





Derek is really excited about his first world book day, he would really like to dress up as a famous character from literature but he needs your help.


Can you design him a costume?
