# **SUBJECT NEWS - English**

#### <u>Y5</u>

Continue to read the fantastic 'Podkin One Ear' by Keiran Larwood. They are looking at how to create effective descriptions, imaginative worlds and how novels are structured.

#### <u>Y6</u>

Well done to all of Year 6 on their fantastic work with the Y6 SATs papers. Over the course of the next few weeks we will be looking at writing skills and creating some amazing pieces of writing for out Writing SATs. We will then move on to completing Windrush Child and exploring short stories from around the world

#### <u>Y7</u>

In Literary Heritage, pupils have been focussing on the play A Midsummer Night's Dream by William Shakespeare, looking at how the love potion affects the characters, focussing on the theme of consent and exploring how to build effective analytical paragraphs. We are now moving on to creative writing practice, with a focus on short stories.

#### <u>Y8</u>

Are in the process of completing work on Arthur Conan Doyle's Sherlock Holmes short stories (starting with A Scandal in Bohemia). They've been looking at the context of Victorian attitudes (particularly attitudes to gender), the history of detective fiction and how to effectively structure an analytical essay.

#### Other items:

We're excited to announce that, on the 22 May we will be welcoming the fantastic author Simon James Green to Selwood. He will be talking to Year 6 and 7 about his new novel 'Finn Jones Was Here'. #### **Book recommendations for May:**

#### The Sleepover Takeover' by Simon James Green

For Otis, this was a sleepover to remember - if only he could! When dorky, unpopular 11-yr-old Otis wakes up in the morning at a sleepover birthday party, he's in for a shock.
