Year 5 - This term, Year 5will begin learning about story structure by studying a novel - these include 'Cloud busting' by Malorie Blackman and 'Jamie' by LD Lipinski. 'Cloud busting' includes themes of friendship and identity, while being told through the medium of poetry.

'Jamie' looks at identity and belonging.

Year 6 - This term Year 6 will be studying 'Windrush Child' by Benjamin Zephaniah, learning about the Windrush generation, their impact on Britain and themes of belonging and discrimination.

Year 7 - Will be continuing their study of Oliver Twist looking at writing topic sentences and finding evidence to support their ideas.

Year 8 - Will be continuing Sherlock Holmes, studying the stories 'A Scandal In Bohemia', 'The Red-Headed League' and 'The Blue Carbuncle'. They will be learning how to pick out effective quotations and structure an analytical paragraph.

Congratulation to 5En/CAI who made the most progress this month, with 54% improvement in their Bedrock scores.

Book of the month: The Ballad Of Songbirds and Snakes - Suzanne Collins.

This year the Christmas Lunch for pupils will be held on Friday 08 December 2023. The deadline for placing your order and paying for the lunch is Friday 17 November 2023. CAREERS UPDATE



At particular points, we aim to pass on some career information and in particular potential future examples of education and career pathways.

Film or TV producer

Film or TV producers manage the process of a production from start to finish. They have the initial idea and source the financial backing to fund the project. The producer commissions the director and other key members of the team, and draws up schedules and budgets.

The production team gives support with finance, locations, equipment, casting, transport, catering, etc. They also handle the advertising, promotion and distribution of the production. Production assistants and runners carry out admin tasks under the direction of the production manager and producer. Producers ensure that the film or TV show is competed on time and within budget. The work often involves time pressures, anti-social hours and the need to work away from home.

Nurse

Adult nurses work with sick and injured people or with people who have physical disabilities in a variety of settings including hospitals and the community. They are part of a team of health professionals who support individuals and their families. Nurses assess, plan, implement and evaluate the care needed for individual patients and keep a record of their progress. They also use counselling, managing and teaching skills when working with patients to help them to improve the quality of their lives. In their daily routine, they check temperatures, take blood pressure, clean and dress wounds, give drugs and injections and use a range of equipment. It is possible to develop in a specific area of health work and career progression can lead to further training as a nurse practitioner. Nurses are caring, compassionate and empathetic; they are organised and have the ability to set people at their ease.


