

Pumpkin Cake



Ingredients

750g/1lb 10oz pumpkin or butterr	nut squash, peeled, deseeded and cut into chur
350g sweet shortcrust pastry	
Plain flour, for dusting	For drenching and frosting
140g caster sugar	200g pack soft cheese
½ tsp salt	85g butter, softened
½ tsp fresh nutmeg, grated	100g icing sugar, sifted
1 tsp cinnamon	zest 1 orange and juice of half
2 eggs, beaten	
25g butter, melted	
175ml milk	
1 tbsp icing sugar	

Method

STEP 1

Place the pumpkin in a large saucepan, cover with water and bring to the boil. Cover with a lid and simmer for 15 mins or until tender. Drain pumpkin, let cool.

STEP 2

Heat oven to 180C gas 4. Roll out the pastry on a lightly floured surface and use it to line a 22cm loose-bottomed tart tin. Chill for 15 mins. Line the pastry with baking parchment and baking beans, then bake for 15 mins. Remove the beans and paper, and cook for a further 10 mins until the base is pale golden and biscuity. Take it out the oven, let cool.

STEP 3

Increase oven to 220C / gas 7. Push the cooled pumpkin through a sieve into a large bowl. In a separate bowl, combine the sugar, salt, nutmeg and half the cinnamon. Mix in the beaten eggs, melted butter and milk, then add to the pumpkin purée and stir to combine.


STEP 4

Pour into the tart shell and cook for 10 mins, then reduce the temperature to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Continue to bake for 35-40 mins until the filling has just set.

STEP 5

Leave to cool, then remove the pie from the tin. Mix the remaining cinnamon with the icing sugar and dust over the pie. Serve chilled.

Guy Fawkes



Guy Fawkes was a person in the Stuart era and tried to commit treason but failed. When Elizabeth I died, James I came to the throne, he wanted Catholics to become protestants. People did not like this, so a group of Catholics came up with a plan to kill the king.

In 1604, Guy Fawkes put a load of gunpowder under the houses of parliament to blow up the king. The plan was spoiled because soldiers came and they arrested him. He was put on the rack and was stretched. By day 6 Fawkes said everything and the rest of the were slaughtered to death. The environment

<u>Palm oil</u>

Deforestation and the destruction of the forest habitat is the leading cause of extinction on the planet. - This is not a school charity event if you want to donate to the Save the Children Christmas Jumper Day, please do so directly to their charity.




Maths update

Year 5 - In year 5 we are starting to look at fractions - focusing initially on equivalent fractions and converting between mixed and improper fractions.

Year 6 - In year 6 we are continuing to build our fractions knowledge looking at adding and subtracting fractions with different denominators as well as mixed number fractions.

Year 7 - In year 7 we are looking at decimals and measures and relating this to length, mass and capacity.

Year 8 - In year 8 we are concluding our unit on area and volume where we have looked at finding the surface area of cubes and cuboids.



English:


Year 5 are currently reading the novel 'Cloudbusting' by Malorie Blackman (written entirely in poetry), as well as studying story structure. They have been writing shape poems modelled on chapters in the book.

<u>Year 6</u> are looking at myths and legends from around the world. They will be studying story structure and will be creating their own myth. Having just finished their practice SATs papers, they are now creating their own mythical creatures ready to create their own myths at the end of the term.

<u>Year 7</u> Continue with English mastery. They are focussing on writing about characters in Oliver Twist and have been learning about why some of the descriptions in the novel are problematic - this week has had a focus on why the description of Fagin may be considered antisemitic. Over the coming weeks they will be focussing on how the heroes and villains of the story are presented - with a

particular focus on Bill Sikes.

Year 8 Are learning about genre and focusing on dystopian fiction. They will be looking at a range of extracts from dystopian fictions, studying the rules for a dystopian text and then creating their own dystopian pieces of writing. They have looked at '1984' and 'The Hunger Games' and are now starting to create their own dystopian worlds.



'Stone' synopsis:


