

Pupil Premium Funding 2017-2018

For review: September 2018

Context and Background:

The Pupil Premium Grant is additional funding given to publicly funded schools in England to raise the attainment of disadvantaged pupils and close the gap between them and their peers. The overall percentage of pupils eligible for PPG is 28%.

The grant is paid to schools according to the number of pupils who have been:

- Registered as eligible for free school meals at any point in the last 6 years.
- Been in care for 6 months or longer.
- Service children.

Prior Attainment:	A gap in attainment exists between pupils eligible for PPG funding and those who are not.

Objectives and Success Criteria 2017-2018:

- The gap in achievement between PP pupils and non-PP pupils is narrowed, so that achievement is in line with non-PP achievement.
- To ensure PP pupils' well-being and engagement with school is supported effectively.

Success Criteria:

- PP achievement meets or exceeds individualised progress and attainment estimations.
- School staff champion PP achievement.
- PP achievement is effectively supported by parents'/carers' engagement.
- PP engagement in and enjoyment of, learning inside and outside of school is promoted and facilitated.
- Pupils engage successfully with education at Year 9 and beyond.
