Dear Parents / Carers

I hope you, your family, and loved ones are remaining safe and well at home as we prepare to work towards our roadmap out of restrictions. I write to you today to give you a clearer understanding of how we will undertake the return to school for all students. You should know that I am legally responsible for your child's safety and well-being in school, and therefore this is my highest priority.

On Monday 8 March all pupils in Year's 5 and 6, as well as those students currently attending school will return to school for full lessons. For students in Year 7 who opt into undertaking testing, they will be allocated a time to come into school to administer their test and then return home. Students do not need to wear school uniform when only attending to undertake their test. Year 8 students who are not currently attending school will continue to work from home for this day.

On Tuesday 9 March all pupils in Year's 5, 6 and 7, as well as those students who are currently attending school in Year 8 will attend school for full lessons. For students in Year 8 who opt into undertaking testing, they will be allocated a time to come into school to administer their test and then return home. Students do not need to wear school uniform when only attending to undertake their test.

From Wednesday 10 March all pupils will return to school. Students that have opted into testing will undertake their further 2 tests over the next week before transitioning to home testing.

Further Information, especially concerning the testing process will be provided at the earliest opportunity as plans are finalised.

Upon arrival students should go to their tutor rooms as they did previously. Students should continue to wear PE kit on the days that they have PE and school uniform at all other times.
