Selwood's Offer - SEN training for staff

Schools are legally required to support children with SEND under the Children and Families Act 2014 and the SEND Code of Practice, which means staff must have the skills to meet those needs. While there is no single mandatory SEND course for all teachers, Selwood have provided the following training this academic year:

- Emotional regulation and anxiety.
- "The As" - ADHD and Autism.
- Neurodiversity - "The Ds" - dyslexia, dyspraxia, dyscalculia, dysgraphia.
- How to support pupils who have speech and language difficulties, DLD etc.
- EpiPen training

We also provide staff with regular updates with new successful strategies for individual pupils regularly.

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
SENCo Spotlight!

Celebrity Spotlight - Daniel Radcliff

Daniel Radcliffe has openly discussed living with a mild form of dyspraxia, a neurological disorder that affects motor skills, coordination, and sometimes spatial awareness. As a child, he experienced challenges with tasks such as handwriting and tying shoelaces. Despite these struggles, he has used his platform to advocate for those with the condition, emphasizing that it did not hold him back.
