Battlefields

On 3rd June, pupils left bright and early for this year's Battlefields trip. Upon arrival, they visited Lijssenthoek Military Cemetery to explore the role of women in the war and medicine and medical developments through the war. The group then visited graves of different religions and a female nurse's grave—the first war placing women in forward military roles.





The second day was very moving and memorable as they continued their Battlefields tour across Belgium. It began at Langemark German Cemetery, where over 44,000 German soldiers rest, including 25,000 in a single mass grave. Next was Tyne Cot Cemetery, the largest Commonwealth site on the Western Front, with 11,953 burials and a memorial to 34,888 soldiers lost.

At the Memorial Museum Passchendaele 1917, pupils learned about one of WWI's bloodiest battles—half a million men died in 100 days. The tour continued to Essex Farm, where Colonel John McCrae wrote In Flanders Fields and 15-year-old Pt. V.J. Strudwick, the youngest known casualty, is buried. A visit to In Flanders Fields Museum deepened understanding of the human stories behind the conflict.





No visit to Belgium is complete without Leonidas Chocolate Shop—a sweet treat and hit with pupils!

The day ended with the moving Last Post
Ceremony at the Menin Gate, where pupils laid
wreaths in remembrance.with us all.

Battlefields

The third day was another moving and memorable one. First stop: Thiepval Memorial and Interpretative Centre, commemorating 73,077 British soldiers who fell at the Battle of the Somme. A poignant moment for Mrs. Ibbitson, who found a relative's name among the fallen.





Then to the Ulster Tower, marking where the 36th (Ulster) Division attacked on 1 July 1916. Next was the Beaumont-Hamel Newfoundland Memorial, honouring brave Newfoundlanders lost with no known grave.

At the Lochnagar Crater, we stood in awe at the massive scar left by 25,000 kilos of explosives—an explosion heard in London. The final stop was the striking Vimy Ridge Memorial, a tribute to all Canadians who served in WWI, especially the 60,000 who died in France. The names of 11,000 with no known grave are etched in stone.



The day ended on a lighter note with a fiercely competitive bowling match—spirits high, rivalries friendly!


Another powerful day of learning, reflection, and connection.

Generation 2 Generation presentation

On 24th June, Selwood Academy hosted Peter Kammerling, whose Mother and Father came to Britain in 1939 as part of the Jewish 'Kinder transports' escaping Nazi Germany.

Generation 2 generation is a company that employs the children of those that survived the Holocaust to come into schools and educate by telling their own personal stories.



Peter gave a heartwarming and sometimes harrowing account of his parents' survival, while 17 of his extended great Uncles, Aunts, cousins and all his Gran-parents were murdered during the Holocaust.

Year 8 pupils sat respectfully silent throughout and some were visible moved by the story. The message of standing up to bullying and persecution and respect for all human beings, was delivered passionately and with great skill.

Peter's late Father Walter Kammerling, served in the British Army during the war and devoted his life after to educating young people about the Holocaust. In 1996, he received a British Empire Medal from Prince Charles (Now King Charles)

Peter was thanked at the end and questioned by inspired pupils.

What Parents & Educators Need to Know about

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

Tablets remain a staple of children's digital lives – and Apple's iPad is by far the most popular model. According to Ofcom, over half of younger children regularly use a tablet to play games, watch online content or access apps. With their broad functionality, iPads can be helpful tools, but without supervision, they may expose children to risks ranging from inappropriate content to screen overuse.

COSTLY TO REPAIR

Unlike some child-friendly tablets the iPad is not built for rough handling. Its slim design and high cost mean that a drop or spill can result in a costly repair. If a child is using the device regularly, a sturdy case and screen protector are strongly recommended to help prevent accidental damage

DATA PRIVACY

While Apple is known for strong privacy protections, a recent study found that many ioS apps aimed at children still share personal data. Over 40% of the tested apps sent at least one piece of user information to third parties, raising concerns about advertising and analytics being targeted at underage users.

INAPPROPRIATE CONTENT

The App Store and Safari browser provide almost unrestricted access to online material. Children may stumble upon age-inappropriate content, whether through apps, advertisements or online searches. Even recommended content

SCREEN ADDICTION

iPads can be highly immersive, and excessive behavioural development. Signs of overuse might include mood swings, irritability, and difficulty focusing on non-digital activities

REDUCED ATTENTION & COGNITIVE IMPACT

Prolonged use of tablets has been linked with reduced memory, slower processing speeds and difficulties in concentrating. Research shows that children who spend excessive time gaming or consuming media on tablets may struggle with language development and executive functioning over time.

Advice for Parents & Educators

ENABLE FAMILY SHARING

Family Sharing allows you to create a dedicated Apple ID for your child and manage their activity. You can approve purchases, control what content they can access, and set time limits – all done remotely from your own device. It's a simple but powerful way to maintain oversight.

FILTER APPS, WEBSITES & IN-APP PURCHASES

Parental controls in iOS let you block explicit content in Safari, restrict app downloads, and manage in-app purchase permissions. You can also filter websites automatically to prevent access to adult material and disable the installation of certain app types completely

USE SCREEN TIME FEATURES EFFECTIVELY

Tools like Downtime and App Limits can reduce device overuse. Downtime allows you to block access during key times – such as before bed or during homework – while App Limits sets daily time caps on specific games or apps Alerts help children anticipate when their time is almost up.



PREVENT UNAPPROVED SPENDING

Children can accidentally (or intentionally) make purchases within apps Activating Ask to Buy under Family Sharing ensures you receive a notification to approve any app or in-app purchase. This stops surprise charges and allow you to discuss purchases together before they're made.
