Attendance

We are really proud of several of our children who have achieved 100% for the Spring 1 term

We are monitoring who has managed to get 100% for each half-term (some children might not have got 100% in the autumn but if they did in Spring term they will get a certificate) For January to February (Spring 1) we have 59 children who have had 100% attendance! We currently have 15 children who have had 100% since September

<u>Car Parking and new build –</u> <u>urgent message for after half-term (from</u> 3rd March)

The new building is progressing really well However they are now at the stage where they need to build the new outdoor learning area for the Early Years (Nursery and Reception)

This means they will need to take over half of the staff car park (which is already very small for the number of staff we have) **from 3rd March** Therefore several more staff are going to have to park their cars on the road during the day from that date.

The road is already busy with contractors' cars and current staff cars.

This is obviously going to have an impact on parking for parents at the start and the end of the day since it will mean even less places to park cars.

Thankfully this is happening when hopefully it will be lighter and maybe even better weather (?!) which we hope means more children/families will be walking to school rather than coming in the car.

Can we please ask that any families that are able to walk to school do so. It is good for mental well-being and fitness and will ease the stress of a very busy road at the start and end of the day.

We will look at a reward scheme for children who walk to school (even if parents have to drive but park further away from Peacock Hall Road and walk from there.

This situation will be throughout the rest of this academic year from 3rd March to the end of July.

We urge parents/carers to take extra special care when driving down Peacock Hall Road and do not park on zig-zags or in front of drives as this will endanger lives.

We will continue to explore options to ease the parking stress.
