Thank you so much to all those parents who have walked to school or been able to park a little bit away from school in order to ease congestion on Peacock Hall Road.

Please remember that we are aiming for our children to be in school for AT LEAST 96% of the time on average across the school Ideally we want 100% attendance as that means they are not missing out on any learning
