These gangs prey on vulnerable people in our community, so we have to look out for each other.

We are having attendance meetings with parents at the moment. We are starting with children below 80% but will be sending out letters to other parents (and meeting other parents) where the attendance is 90% or below (which counts as 'persistent absence')

We are required to do all we can to support you to get your child into school so they do not miss out on their education. The longer a child is off the worse their life chances. Obviously sometimes medical reasons can be a barrier but we are here to help and support you to ensure your child's attendance is as good as it can possibly be.

Our target for attendance is 96% and we will be reviewing where children are up to and having meetings with parents for those that are in danger of not achieving their academic potential due to poor attendance.
