### Sickness, absences & punctuality

The punctuality is really improving in school and I know that, despite the challenges, pare nts are doing their best to get children in to sc hool on time across the classes. Well done!

There is a lot of sickness at the moment (not j ust our school but across the county & not jus t children but adults too) so we are reminding children to wash hands regularly and our clea ning team are doing deep cleans of high touc h areas in each of the classes.

If any child is ill (vomiting or diarrhea) then the ey need to stay off school for 48 hours after the last 'episode'.

Any illness is 'authorised' absence.

If your child is going to be absent please report it to the office on either Class Dojo or phone (leave a message if you need to) rather than the class teacher (who is very busy and may not get the message until later in the day - you can tell the teacher as well)

Letters have been going out to parents about attendance. If a child's attendance drops belo w a certain percentage (80%, 90% and 96%) we are required to demonstrate that we have informed parents and sent out letters (it is par t of the stricter requirements on schools arou nd attendance and something we have to rep

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ort on to governors and Ofsted - including what actions we have taken).

We realise that in many cases this is authoris ed absence, and often due to exceptional circ umstances, but we are still required to let you know.

We will always work with parents to support g ood attendance for all children as we all know that children's learning is crucial and absence from school makes learning more ch allenging for pupils.

If attendance gets worse or continues to be a concern we would invite parents to a meeting but for most parents it is a matter of making y ou aware where their attendance is so that w e can try to improve it over the rest of the year.
