PSHE and Our School Values

<u>HELPING AT HOME</u> - Please continue to read regularly at home. Reading for pleasure is the best way to expand your vocabulary and fluency. Continuing to practice your times table regularly is also very useful as times table knowledge is used throughout our mathematical learning and makes both arithmetic and reasoning much easier when you know them well. Voluntary homework sheets based on revision and test questions will be offered weekly. Spellinas will be put onto Doio so they can be practised at home.

<u>English</u> - We are starting with classic texts this term. The children will be exposed to a variety of texts that are older but still well-loved. They will get the opportunity to read and enjoy these texts in their free time. In our English lessons, we will be studying The Wizard of Oz and build up to writing our own short version of the story. After that, we will be moving onto Romeo and Juliet and brushing up our barding skills to hopefully include some acting.

<u>NUMERACY</u> We use the Red Rose Lancashire scheme for our Maths lessons. This term, we will begin with geometry; in particular finding missing angles in triangles and other shapes. We will be reading and interpreting Pie charts as part of statistics unit. After this, it is refreshing ourselves with place value including rounding and multiplying by 10, 100, 1000 etc.
