Vision

'To open doors for all our children to experiences and opportunities that they may not have access to, enhancing the curriculum and helping to nurture, develop and stretch pupils' talents and skills'

It is our aim to support pupils' learning and embed understanding by providing experiences and opportunities to all pupils during their time with us. Over the last 3 years opportunities to enhance the pupils' curriculum have included:
