#### Car Parking PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN FRONT OF THE DRIVEWAYS OF OUR NEIGHBOURS WHEN DROPPING OFF OR COLLECTING YOUR CHILD FROM SCHOOL.

Our neighbours are true pointenorice friends to our school keeping an eye on it over the weekends and holidays to make sure it is safe and free from vandals.



However, a minority of parents are parking in front of the private driveways. According to the Highway Code, it's an offence to park across driveways, and it's illegal to park over dropped kerbs - even a little bit. Our neighbours have mentioned that it is happening regularly and have not been able to use their drives to get out for work or appointments on time or not get in with young children after a busy day.

The police will be informed if any parents are breaking the highway code and the police have said they will visit anyone doing so.

Many thanks to all those parents who are showing respect to the local residents by parking away from the driveways.

If you cannot find a space on the road you will need to park further away from the school and walk (we will not let your children go until you arrive).

### WORLD BOOK DAY 1st MARCH

## **Tiger Hunt!**

Our wonderful Moons class (Nursery) went on a tiger hunt around school this week looking for (pictures of) tigers and getting really excited when they found one. The pictures were all over the school and it helped our youngest children find their way round school, develop their counting skills (there were ten tigers altogether) and also to meet lots of teachers, TAs and older children that they don't normally see.

#### PRIME drinks

Recently we've had a few cases of children bringing bottles of 'Prime Hydration' to school. Although there are no serious



health risks to children associated with drinking 'Prime Hydration' the drink does contain a high level of electrolytes. Electrolytes aren't recommended for children unless they are unwell or at risk of dehydration.

Another form of the drink, 'Prime Energy', contains around 200mg of caffeine for every 330ml and as a result is not recommended for children under the age of 18.

As a result we have taken the decision (in line with a number of other schools) to ban all forms of the Prime drink. Children should therefore not bring it to school as part of their lunchtime drinks. Other drinks that are not allowed in school include all fizzy drinks and all other energy drinks. For lunchtime children are allowed to bring squash, fruit juice, milk, milkshakes, smoothies or flavoured water.

We still encourage children to bring additional water only in a bottle to drink in class during the day

On Thursday we had our friends from the police support and intervention team come in to deliver an Internet Safety talk to all the children in Years 5 and 6.

We also had some parents of Years 5 and 6 children come to a mini-workshop on how to keep our children safe in a digital world.

The parent presentation is going out on Class Dojo and we will regularly send out internet safety tips and newsletters for parents to help you support your families in keeping safe on-line.

The next parents' presentation will be on-line by Zoom on a date to be arranged but within the next few weeks (and will be available for all parents to attend).

### **BEHAVIOUR TARGETS**

We have three key targets for behaviour in our school this term (please help us by reinforcing these messages at home):

**LANGUAGE** (being kind and respectful in what they say to others face-to-face or on-line. No inappropriate or nasty words or name-calling).

This can be modelled by adults by making sure children do not hear older roles models (parents, siblings etc) using inappropriate language in school.

**LISTEN** (to listen with respect to others, and especially adults, during learning or when an adult is trying to sort out a problem during play).

This can be modelled by the way adults also listen to each other.

**WALK** (when indoors to walk at all times. Do not run in corridors or across the hall - to avoid accidents and make sure the school is calm).

### Pets

Do not bring any pets onto the school grounds. The only pets allowed will be those agreed by the school (*e.g.* guide dogs).

### **OPAL**
