Site Supervisor Role

Our wonderful Irene Salmon is retiring on 8th March. Irene has been at Seven Stars school for over thirty years and we will be so sad to see her leave. We are ever so grateful for all she has done and we will be celebrating Irene's time with us at some point over the next few weeks.

In the meantime we are looking for someone to replace Irene in the role of Site Supervisor.

The post is advertised on the School Website in the 'About us' section and in the Vacancies and Volunteers section. The role will be for a Grade 5 Site Supervisor for 30 hours a week (including opening up the school in the morning and some unsociable hours)

The job will involve ensuring the security of the premises, overseeing, supervising and supporting the cleaning of the school, keeping up to date with Health and Safety requirements (including tests, checks and maintaining Health and Safety records), liaising with the Local Authority and other companies and general maintenance of the school premises. If you are interested either go on the school website and download the application form.
