Reading at School and at Home

Thank you to those governors and staff who are coming in voluntarily to school to hear children read. Colin Sharples and Carol Stunell as well as Anna Stafford are all coming in the support our children in their reading. Please make sure your child brings their book in each day so they can read and we are hoping that we can start sending home library books to all classes. Please however make sure the children value the books and do not lose them. They are very precious!

Research shows that if children are not read to before they start school they will only have met 5000 words, BUT children who are read to twice or more a week will have met 70,000 words and 5 times a week will have met 1.5 million words - before they have even started school!

You can see the importance of reading TO children as often as possible (and it makes children feel loved).

Phonics Shed

We are very excited about a new Phonics Scheme that we are introducing to the children from Nursery through to some children in Year 3.

Phonics Shed is a story based multi-sensory systematic synthetic phonics programme that introduces children to the sounds and letters (the phonemes and graphemes) that they need to read and to write. The scheme also has 'decodeable' books that the children will read using their new phonics skills. We will run parent workshops all about it and you can visit the web-site at the link below:

Great Work!

There has been so much amazing work going on round school:

- In Year 5 a great reading lesson took place based on a book called the Breadwinner- it is about a young girl in Afghanistan at the time of the Taliban and is not allowed to go to school. It linked in very well with the current news and provoked some excellent discussion in class.
- In Year 6 there was another excellent reading session based on a whole class book with superb responses demonstrating empathy and understanding in a text about diversity
- In Year 4 the children have been really engaged writing their own Greek Myths based on Theseus and the Minotaur. They created their own mythical monster for Theseus to defeat.
- In Year 3 some super work on the inspirational Martin Luther King 'I have a Dream' speech has been taking
- In Year 2 the children have been investigating how objects made out of different materials could be changed by twisting, bending, stretching and squashing. The engagement from the children was fantastic and the children were able to make links between the materials used and the ways they could be changed
- Our younger children have been doing some terrific story telling of The Little Red Hen (actions, recount, a collaborative painted story board, ' scooting' the story on a Little Red Hen story trail outdoors, putting their own spin on the story using different characters, and building the story in construction) two children wrote and drew their own A2 story book and these are now laminated and on our bookshelf for the children to share together: they love them!
- Classes from Years 3 to 6 have been enjoying their Spanish lessons with Miss Fletcher (and Year 2s have also enjoyed their Spanish club on a Monday) the Year 5s and Year 6s now know how to ask to go to the toilet in Spanish! (amongst other things)
- The Year 5 and Year 6 children are having great fun learning the ukulele in their music lessons with Mr Stott and the choir are sounding beautiful on a Thursday after school.
