A Grand Opening Ceremony

We also said a huge thank you to James Dyer who has been our CONLONs site manager throughout the project and has shown immense patience, support and willingness to do all he can for the children and school.

Darren Lee and Claire Singleton also came from CONLONs to support the event as did a number of the school governors – and of course Charlie CONLON made an appearance!

It was also lovely to see PCSO Tony attending to represent the local community police. Tony has supported our school for at least 25 years and also leads one of the local scout groups.

We are so proud of our new school. Mr Mayor cut the ribbon to the entrance to the school for us and then sampled one of our parents delicious cakes!



Time Capsule

In our Grand Opening Ceremony we revealed our Time Capsule which we are going to fill with items from 2026 to be opened in 2050 – 24 years from now.

We are including a letter, composed by the children to the children of the future Seven Stars, a TV guide and Lancashire Newspaper from this week. 

HOW DOES ATTENDANCE IMPACT EDUCATION?

Less than 80%	80% - 89.9%	90% - 95.9%	96% – 100%
Over whole of primary career equal to average of <u>over</u> 1 year of lost learning	Over whole of primary career equal to 960 missed lessons	Over whole of primary career equal to 960 missed lessons	Even an average of 96% over the whole of a primary career still means 1 term of missed learning – but to be above 96% is good.
Any child whose attendance is below 90% is classed as 'persistently absent' and we will arrange a meeting with parents to put a plan into place and discuss further action. We try to be as supportive as we can and work in partnership with parents but must stick to our policies and DfE guidelines. Parents are liable to a fine of £80 if paid within 21 days or £160 if paid within 28 days	Any child whose attendance is here after the first few weeks is 'of concern' and we will monitor them closely.		We can only authorise holidays for exceptional circumstances at the discretion of the Head teacher.
Please be aware that if your child's attendance is Red or Yellow then it may mean we cannot authorise holidays in term time (which may result in a fine being issued by Lancashire if these holidays are then taken without being authorised)			
Please see the attendance letter that went out on Class Dojo on Friday and the attendance certificates/reports that went out at the end of the week with a red, yellow or green dot on. We will continue to monitor attendance in the weeks to come.
