We talked about how it reminds us of our school values of Courage (in the face of challenges) Kindness (being selfless) and Resilience (when things get tough).

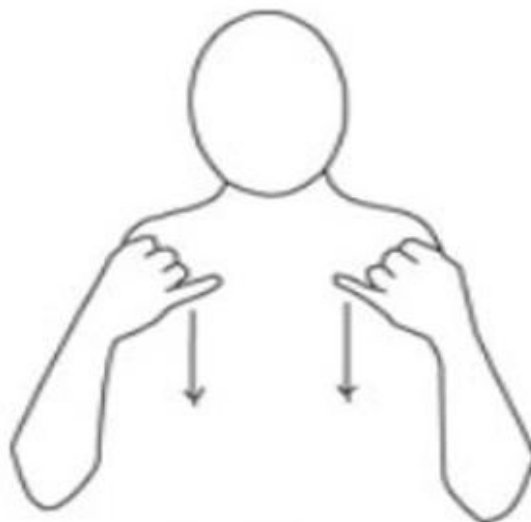
We had a minutes silence as we thought about all those heroes past and present and their families who were and have been and still are affected by war.

Welly stores

Some parents have been asking about when children can bring their wellies in.

We are ordering welly stores (two have arrived already) and are awaiting their arrival.

Once the MUGA and additional play area has been completed in the week beginning 9th December then I will do a message to all parents and by that time the other stores will be in place and we can go full-on wellies.

We need to get a system into place to avoid bringing mud into school and the welly stores are key to this.

New Build

We are so pleased with the progress being made on completion of our school by CONLONs. The MUGA (Multi-Use Games Area) is almost ready and several playground areas are being developed and should be completed by the end of December.

We will let you know what arrangements will be in place for parents to enter and leave the school once all the paths have been finished.

We will eventually have very large outdoor areas which the children can enjoy.

We have a provisional date of 14th January for our grand opening ceremony but will confirm that nearer the time (it will be 9.30am for one hour).
