ATTENDANCE (& being on time) MATTERS

Letters have gone home indicating you child's attendance this year.

We are aware that circumstances are difficult for some children with medical conditions, home circumstances or as a result of the pandemic (and with some children it may be a result of specific reasons as discussed with the school). For some parents we have already had conversations which we hope you have found supportive. However, we are required to inform every parent of what their child's attendance is over the year.

The next academic year is a fresh start and our aim is to help every parent/carer to support to improve their child's attendance or, if it was above 96% this year, to maintain their good attendance.

How can we improve the attendance of our children?

- Ask for help from school if you are struggling to get your child into school.
- Try to book medical appointments out of school hours if possible (we realise this is not always possible but ask if they can be).
- Get children to school on time (if they are late it affects attendance % and their education).
- Do not book holidays during term-time (forms must be completed for exceptional circumstances) – the school dates for next year are on the school web-site & newsletter.
- Only keep your child off school if they are clearly not well e.g. sickness, diarrhoea, temperature, persistent cough (some children who say they are not well are fine once they get in).
